

UBE Umbraco-Macros-General

Macros are coded procedures built by UBE to make it easier for you to add content whilst preserving the presentation of the content on the web page.

Many macros have been built and UBE will let you know which ones you can use on your website.

There are two types of macro:

1. Those that are self-contained and don't refer to any other pages. They may need some information – called parameters – when you install them on a page. Examples are:
 - a. Contact Form. A simple form that a site visitor completes to send information to a pre-defined email address. The email address is the parameter you complete when installing this macro.
 - b. Display a Google map of a location. The parameters include the location's post code or longitude and latitude.
2. Those that refer to files (pictures or documents) to display them on a web page. Examples include:
 - a. Picture slider. The macro refers to the pictures that are to be displayed in a carousel.
 - b. A table of meetings with links to agendas and minutes. The macro refers to each meeting's date and place and has links to its related documents and then displays them on the web page in a table.
